"Being near the motorway the travel is good. I'm living down in Laugharne, beautiful and quiet in the winter. Busier in the summer now we've had a TV series down there and Dylan Thomas of course. To be fair I liked "Keeing Faith" brought some excitement to the village."

"A lot of the boys are still rugby mad, a few still playing and a few following the Swans. I'm a runner, half marathons, nothing crazy. The kids have me running around plenty."

"I do mostly nights 5PM -5AM. Sounds crazy but you get into it after the first couple and then you're away. Days off in the week is good then. Seeing the kids more, taking them into, or picking them up, sometimes both."

"Doing a carpentry course at Night school - college, one night a week. People will always want hand made work, and there's quite a few places down here. I really like some of the old Welsh dressers. We've got one in the house, been in the family for generations.

"There's a lot of madness in the world but there will always be work for people who want it. We have people working here from miles away, staying in digs for their working days and then going back to their families. I respect that"
